







## **Race Bulletin**

The Hong Kong, China Rowing Association (HKCRA) welcomes crews from local and overseas clubs to compete at the 9<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Rowing International Masters Regatta.

Date : 13<sup>th</sup> April 2025 (Sunday)

Organised by : Hong Kong, China Rowing Association (HKCRA)

Entry deadline : 14<sup>th</sup> March 2025 (Friday) before 12:00 noon (HK Time)

\*\*The final race schedule will be subject to the number of entries and will be published on or before 28<sup>th</sup> March 2025. The final start list will be published no later than 4<sup>th</sup> April 2025.









### 1. VENUE AND COMPETITION COURSE

The Regatta will be based at the Jockey Club Sha Tin Rowing Centre and the Jockey Club Shek Mun Rowing Centre, both of which are in Sha Tin adjacent to the Shing Mun River and are managed by HKCRA. Racing will take place on the Shing Mun Regatta Course which is a tidal river.

### 2. EVENTS

Race Lane Draw - A random draw for Heats (where required) and race lanes will be conducted on **Wednesday**, **2**<sup>nd</sup> **April 2025**, at 7:00 p.m. HK Time at the Jockey Club Sha Tin Rowing Centre.

### **Race Distance**

All events' distance will be 1,000 meters, starting from a fixed starting pontoon.

- All competitors must reach the age of 27 or above on 31st December 2025 (excluding coxswains).
- Mixed Events crews must comprise half men and half women rowers (excluding coxswains).
- (1.) Club representatives are advised to make their entries with reference to the "Preliminary Race Schedule", especially for competitors entering more than one event. The race schedule may be updated subject to the total number of entries received in each event. HKCRA will not update the race schedule due solely to the double entry of any rowers.

Each competitor may enter any number of Men's events or Women's events, but can only enter one Mixed event (Each competitor can only enter one Masters Age-group Category in the same event). In addition, due to the limited number of available boats for rental, the Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to limit the number of entries accepted, based on the race schedule and the number of available rental boats.







(2.) The Masters events (Men's, Women's and Mixed) are held according to the World Rowing Masters Categories as follows:

Masters A - Minimum age 27 years

Masters B - Average age 36 years or above

Masters C - Average age 43 years or above

Masters D - Average age 50 years or above

Masters E - Average age 55 years or above

Masters F - Average age 60 years or above

Masters G - Average age 65 years or above

Masters H - Average age 70 years or above

Masters I - Average age 75 years or above

Masters J - Average age 80 years or above

Masters K - Average age 83 years or above

Masters L - Average age 86 years or above

Masters M - Average age 89 years or above

(3.) According to Rule 38 of the Rules of Racing, the OC reserves the right to verify the identification document and exclude from an Event any rower who submits false or invalid information.

- (3.) In the case of cancellation of the regatta, only 50% of the paid entry fee will be refunded in view of the need of the HKCRA to bear the logistics and set-up costs.







<sup>\*</sup>The coxswain is not included in the age of a crew. Age categories do not apply to coxswains.



(4.) For Hong Kong residents, all rowers must be **HKCRA Ordinary Members (OM).** All rowers **MUST** renew their membership before the Regatta and no renewals will be processed on the day of the regatta. (Rowers who are not residents in Hong Kong are exempt from this requirement.)

For Hong Kong residents, all crews and rowers must enter and compete under the name of a Club or Organisation registered with the HKCRA. Overseas rowers should enter in the name of a Club affiliated to their national rowing federation. No rower is allowed to compete for more than one Club at the Regatta.

### 4. RULES OF RACING

- (1.) By submitting their entry, each competitor affirms their understanding and agreement to adhere to the HKCRA Rules of Racing and the Competition Notice. Individuals who do not meet the qualifications, fail to comply with the competition requirements, or violate the Rules of Racing at any time—before, during, or after the event—may be disqualified from participation. In such cases, any fees paid will not be refunded.
- (2.) Coxswains must be weighed with racing uniform on tested scales not more than two hours and not less than one hour before the start time of their first race in each event on each day of racing. The minimum weight for a coxswain wearing racing uniform is 50 kgs. To make up this weight, a coxswain may carry additional deadweight as close as practicable to their person in the boat. No article of racing equipment shall be considered as part of this deadweight. The coxswain may be of either gender.
- (3.) Racing uniforms must be uniform across all members of a crew. Local clubs are required to wear the uniforms registered with the HKCRA. Members of composite crews may wear the uniforms of their respective clubs.

## 5. LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

By entering the 9<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Rowing International Masters Regatta, each competitor is agreeing to the Hong Kong, China Rowing Association Terms and Conditions which can be found in **Appendix 1** at the end of this document.

### 6. HEALTH AND FITNESS / INSURANCE

- (1.) Each competitor shall be responsible for their own health and fitness to enter and compete in the Regatta. All competitors shall be able to swim at least 50 meters in light clothing.
- (2.) All Overseas Teams must arrange their own personal insurance.













### 7. BOATS AND OARS RENTAL

- (1.) Competitors are required to utilize their own equipment for the Regatta. However, rental boats will be available for overseas crews as well as local crews whose Clubs lack sufficient equipment. Rental boats and oars will be shared among crews, and the allocation made by the Organising Committee shall be considered final.
- (2.) A limited number of boats and oars are available for rent on a first-come, first-served basis. Teams interested in renting equipment are required to submit the Equipment Rental Online Form by 12:00 noon (Hong Kong Time) on or before 14<sup>th</sup> March 2025 (Friday). A payment request will be issued via PayPal once all details of the request are confirmed. - (3.) Teams using rental boats and/or oars shall be responsible for all repair or replacement charges incurred from any equipment damage and replacement parts resulting from their use.

## 8. MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES

- (1) Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be presented to the first three crews in each final and category respectively. If the number of the entries exceeds the number of racing lanes, the entry will be divided into two or more finals.
- (2) Races of different age categories may be combined and a medal will be awarded to the winning crew in each age category. This applies to both men's, women's, and mixed events.
- (3) In the case of 1 entry in an event, the crew will be required to race and the gold medal will be presented.
- (4) A certificate will be awarded to every competitor.















## 9. ACCOMMODATION AND TRANSPORT ( For Overseas Teams only )

- (1.) Overseas teams shall be responsible for their own accommodation and transport.
- (2.) There are several hotels in the Sha Tin area which are easily accessible to both Rowing Centers.
- (3.) Public transport is very convenient between Sha Tin and the urban areas.

### 10. WEATHER

Hong Kong's climate is sub-tropical. During the month of April, the weather is expected to be rather dry and temperature is generally in the range of  $24^{\circ}$ C to  $28^{\circ}$ C.

### **APPENDIX 1**

## 9<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Rowing International Masters Regatta Terms and Condition of Entry

By entering the 9<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong Rowing International Masters Regatta (the Event), each competitor agrees to the following Terms and Conditions which shall apply to all activities associated with the Event, including training and racing: -

- 1. The participant declares that the participant has full knowledge of the risks involved in water sports and rowing and is well prepared physically and sufficiently fit to compete in the Event.
- 2. The participant declares that they can swim at least 50 meters and is confident under water & treading water in clothing not less than racing uniform. Otherwise, the participant agrees that they shall be responsible to always wear a personal flotation device (pfd) when they are in the boat for the purposes of the Event, whether for training or racing.
- 3. The participant hereby indemnifies the Hong Kong, China Rowing Association (HKCRA), the Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau (CSTB), the Leisure & Cultural Services Department (LCSD), the Supporting Organisations and the appointed officials, volunteers, staff & employees and shall not hold them liable for any claim or demand arising from the death, personal injury, damage or loss of property of the participant or their Club whereby such is not caused by negligence, which may occur in the course of or as a result of participation in the Event.
- 4. The participant agrees that they are entering the Event at his/her own risk and responsibility. The participant discharges the HKCRA, CSTB, LCSD and all other individuals and organisations connected directly or indirectly with the Event from any responsibility in the event of injury, death or loss of property incurred during, as consequence of, or while travelling to and from the Event.
- 5. The participant agrees that they shall comply strictly with all rules, regulations, requirements & instructions related to the Event and the participant shall be responsible for any death, personal injury, or loss to property if such is cause by the violation of such rules, regulations, requirements & instructions by the participant.
- 6. The participant agrees to pay the costs of repair or replacement for any damages to any equipment caused by the participant.
  - **Medical Declaration**: It is the participant's responsibility to make known any potential medical conditions that may affect their health, safety and performance during the Event and related activities and to inform HKCRA, CSTB and LCSD of any subsequent conditions arising from or becoming known during or after the Event.
- 7. By entering the Event, the participant agrees to and confirms to accept and follow all the terms, conditions and points made and subsequently raised in these Terms and Conditions, in the Event Bulletin, the Rules of Racing, the Competition Notice and the Team Managers' Meeting.
